Homelessness	Project up-Start Student Eligibility Questionnaire is included as part of the documents and flyers distributed to all students at the beginning of the school year in English and Spanish. An automated FinalSite communication was sent to all parents/guardians the first week of school encouraging them to complete the Questionnaire. The Assistant Principal ensured that the form was collected from all students. Once collected, the Assistant Principal, the Up-Start Liaison, submitted to Project Up-Start. The questionnaire will be sent two more times throughout the school year.		
Unfamiliar with School System	We provide all documentation, flyers, and important information, such as the procedures to creating a parent portal account, for parents in three different languages. We prioritize parent connections during parent teacher conferences by offering a translator if necessary. We facilitate connections between the subgroup of Students with Disabilities and general education teachers by providing professional development sessions that engage teachers in best practices and methods for respecting the uniqueness of each family while teaching in an inclusive setting effectively.
